Merino Section

- 1- If exhibitor enters a fleece in the Donated Class then all entries are free
- 2- **Fleeces must be delivered to the Pavilion between 8 am and 11 am on Monday 28th February. Judging held on Tuesday 1st March 2022.**
- 3- All fleeces must be delivered in plastic bags, one per bag, with name and Class Number clearly marked
- 4- Fleeces must be skirted for market, the product of one sheep and grown by the Exhibitor in the last growing season (previous 12 months). Judges will make allowances for wool deemed to be overgrown via trueness of types/weight. Sheep must be unhoused
- 5- Hogget wool to be unshorn and is not eligible for Grand Champion
- 6- Rams and Pairs of Fleeces are not eligible for Grand Champion
- 7- Novice Section is open to all exhibitors who have not won a Champion Ribbon
- 8- Highest Point Score to receive Champion Ribbon
- 9- Most Successful Exhibitor awarded on the following scale of points: 3 points for 1st, 2 points for 2nd, 1 point for 3rd and 1.5 points for Champion
- 10- Unclaimed fleeces become the property of the Society after 60 days
- 11- All Fleeces will be tested for Micron and results may be used at the discretion of the Judge

Child's Pet Section

- 12- Child's Pet Fleece, raised by school age child
- 13- All fleeces must be delivered in plastic bags, one per bag, with name and Class Number clearly marked
- 14- **White Merino Fleeces only**
- 16- Fleeces must be skirted for market, the product of one sheep and grown by the Exhibitor in the last growing season (previous 12 months). Judges will make allowances for wool deemed overgrown via the trueness of types/weights. Sheep must be unhoused
- 17- Unclaimed fleeces become the property of the Society after 60 days 18- Fleeces eligible for Champion ribbons in Traditional section
