Please read the general conditions and regulations for Pavilion Exhibits

1. Doors close and Judging commences strictly at 10:00am
2. ***No exhibitor is permitted to be present during judging. This includes exhibitors involved in other divisions of the show who might have access to the judging area. If an exhibitor faces this situation, they must inform the chief steward of their section. Together, they will work to find a mutually agreeable solution. This is to maintain the integrity of the judging process by preventing any potential interference or influence from exhibitors while decisions are being made by the section judges.***
3. Blooms must be grown by the exhibitor. Unless otherwise specified.
4. The show Society has jars available for the staging of blooms- if providing your own, jars must be nondescript and not identifiable to ensure continuity and fairness for judging.
5. Exhibitor to ensure that all stems of flowers and foliage are secure in the container and all entrants must be responsible for topping up the entry with water before leaving.
6. Containers of blooms are not to have any embellishments e.g. water pearls, ribbon, oasis etc. unless otherwise stated.
7. *Prizes shall be determined as follows: For the highest Awards in each Class points shall be allocated on the basis of 3, 2 and 1. The Exhibitor gaining the highest number of points (see exceptions) to be the winner. Should there be fewer than three Awards in any one Class, the points shall be on the said basis in order of merit. In the event of 2 or more Exhibitors securing an equal number of points, the Exhibitor gaining the greatest number of 1st, 2nd or 3rd prizes, in order of preference, shall be the winner. Exhibitors may enter more than one Entry in each Class, but should an Exhibitor win more than one Award in a Class, only the highest placed Award will count towards the Most Successful Exhibitor Award.
8. **Champion will only be awarded if there are more than 3 entries in the section with the exception of the under 6 & 12 yrs sections.

Explanation of terms

D: Distinct (this refers to staging unit and for the larger blooms; each bloom must be distinct from the others. For smaller blooms types it means that each vase is to contain (3) blooms of the (1) variety and each vase is to be a different variety

NND: Not necessarily distinct

AOV: All one variety

SPEC: Specimen meaning one

CHILDRENS SECTION

Enchanted Gardens: must not exceed 30cmx30cm in dimension, must be wholly contained and transportable (not assembled in place and able to be moved if required)

Hand Posy: must not exceed a maximum of 15 stems, can include any variety or foliage, small enough to be held in one hand by the child. Must be collected and assembled by the child. Must be tied with either a rubber band, string or ribbon , or any combination thereof and in a small jar of water.

Specimen stem: one singular stem (flower) of any one variety, must be grown , selected and collected by the child.

Saucer of flowers: Small plate or tea saucer of any flowers, petals, foliage or leaves. Must not exceed 15cm diameter.

Under 6 years

Age to appear on exhibit

1. Saucer of flowers- any foliage, petals, flowers permitted. No embellishments.
2. Enchanted Garden using natural materials (sticks ,stones, leaves, wildflowers etc) figurines may be added.
3. Specimen stem- any one variety

4. Hand posy of flowers -maximum 18 stems
5. Enchanted Garden using natural and/ or recycled materials (bottle caps, sticks ,stones, leaves, wildflowers etc) figurines may be added.

DECORATIVE FLOWERS/ SPECIAL INTEREST

Natural embellishment: These are all things made by nature other than flowers, e.g. dried plant, material, stones, feathers, shells etc. Flower or seed heads from grasses re acceptable. Flowers on plants such as herbs, dock, pussy willow, Malacca balm etc. are not to be removed.

Artificial embellishment: These are anything man made e.g. ribbon, figurines, painted or dried material

Any embellishment: Means that the exhibitor may use natural or artificial embellishment

Free embellishment: This is exhibitors' choice, no restriction with container, materials, height or embellishment, flowers used need not be grown by the exhibitor.

2025 special interest

7. **Bridal-** Create a handcrafted bridal bouquet or "flower crown" using fresh horticultural material, **materials may be purchased/ sourced ie not grown by the exhibitor.** Free embellishments permitted, artificial flowers/ foliage NOT permitted, fresh horticultural material must be predominant. Viewed and judged 360deg . Final dimensions must not exceed 500mm squared.
8. **Arrangement in show theme-** 2025 theme: "Community". Free embellishment, **materials may be purchased/ sourced ie not grown by the exhibitor.** Final dimensions must not exceed 800mm squared, artificial flowers/ foliage NOT permitted must be self contained able to be moved by show steward (not assembled in place).
